The Prince of Peace has come!

"Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests." – Luke: 2:14

Greetings to you in Jesus' Name!

We have come to the last month of 2020. It has been a year with many uncertainties and unprecedented events. Many people have been adversely impacted to varying degrees. Still, we give thanks to God for sustaining us through our trials. One thing most precious to us is finding True Peace in the midst of life's challenges. How do we experience this True Peace when facing suffering and distress?

Jesus says, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." (Jn 14:27)

We thank God for Christmas. It is celebrated in late December – an apt time for us to focus on the Prince of Peace.

Let us explore the principles of True Peace from the Prince of Peace:

1) He came for the meek - The ordinary shepherds!

The coming of the Prince of Peace was very much unexpected by many. People were busy with their mundane lives, and most likely having their usual grouches and lamentations over exhausting tasks and battling against crises. The Prince of Peace came to the shepherds through the angelic host. And the angel said to them, "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord." (Lk 2:10-11)

The Prince of Peace knew the shepherds and did not forget them. He knows us and does not forget us!

2) He came at night

The Prince of Peace came while the world was sleeping. It was when most people were already tired from a long day of work. However, some shepherds were still awake, out in the field, keeping watch over their flock. (Lk 2:8)



No matter whether people were ready to welcome Him, the Prince of Peace came to settle the turbulence that hit at the core of every human soul due to the cancer of sins.

People sleeping in the darkness of sins; people trapped in bondages to the darkness of the world – The Prince of Peace came for them all. His light shines through the darkness!

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CHRISTMAS AMIDST A PANDEMIC

Every year when it is Christmas time, there are people filled with merriment and yet there are people who do not find much Christmas cheer in their life experience.

This year, is the Joy of Christmas going to be eclipsed by the pervasive misery around the world due to the Covid-19 pandemic? The answer to this question depends on the definition of Joy.

True Joy of Christmas

If joy is defined in terms advocated by the commercial world, it is akin to the kind of temporal and temporary pleasures full of secular vibes that obviously have nothing to do with the real Joy of Christmas.

When parents rejoice in welcoming a new-born child, the kind of joy carries with it deep emotions and a lot of unflagging devotion with hope and anticipation.

The true Joy of Christmas is also one filled with hope and anticipation when Christians welcome the Christ Child born upon this day. The long line of OT promises of a Redeemer (Gen 3:14-15; Isa 7:14; etc.) was fulfilled when we ushered in The First Noel

In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!"

- Luke 2:8-14

The new-born has been given a name, Immanuel (Isa 7:14). He is going to be with us henceforth.

This is a gift immeasurably more precious than any beautifully-wrapped presents money can buy. This is Joy immeasurably greater than the ephemeral thrill that any big-bash party can impart.

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"Hopelessness" overcome by Hope

It is humanly unrealistic not to feel the distress of the Covid-19 pandemic. However, instead of displacing the true Joy of Christmas, our sense of "hopelessness" should instead be overcome by the hope of Christmas.

When Isaiah prophesied the coming of the Messiah (Isa 9:6-7), it was not against a backdrop of a trouble-free life for the people. Instead, Judah was in a state of gloom and darkness internally as well as facing external threats. It was in such miserable circumstances that the blessed assurance of salvation through the birth of the Christ Child was emphatically pressed home.

All the destructive occurrences of disasters are the symptom of a sinful world. Disasters, driven by sin, impact relationships between man and God, man and Creation as well as man and man. The famous 17th Century Puritan, Thomas Watson, said, "Sin has turned beauty into deformity."


Yet, in the 2000+ years of Church history, Christians have demonstrated their capacity to rise above disasters (E.g. An ancient pandemic called the Antonine Plaque during the Roman Empire; the Black Death in Europe in the 14th Century) because of their faith, their optimism based on a proper spiritual interpretation of the disasters, their courage in grappling with the issues of suffering and death, the Church's resourcefulness in organising response and support for the needy, etc.

Get those good books

The following are some other relevant quotable quotes attributed to Thomas Watson:

- God sweetens outward pain with inward peace."
- "A weak faith can lay hold on a strong Christ."
- "Affliction may be lasting, but it is not everlasting.
- "When you find a chillness upon your souls, and that your former heat begins to abate,

ply yourselves with warm clothes, **get those good books** that may acquaint you with such truths as may warm and affect your hearts."



Say AYE or YEAH to "get those good books ..." in the last of the above quotes.

In the face of the Covid-19 pandemic, many are in miserable circumstances – with families separated across international borders, with livelihoods disrupted, with concerns over health matters, etc.

I am included in the "we", and I know it is hard to keep hope flying high when crises work to pull it down.

Nevertheless, the more the struggle, the greater is the feeling of human "hopelessness" and hence the need to lean on the inscrutable wisdom of God in defining the moments and directions. For who is able to resist God's will? (Rom 9:19b)

I gain inspiration and strength from "those good books" (which must necessarily include the Bible) to stay the course until the storm blows over.

Sinners' approach to Christmas

"Here is a trustworthy saying that deserves full acceptance: Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners—of whom I am the worst."

- 1 Tim 1:15

Obviously, sin and we (sinners) have everything to do with Christmas. Without sin and sinners, there would be no need for a Saviour - no need for Christmas!

How then do we approach Christmas?

The Covid-19 pandemic places a lot of restrictions that put paid to a lot of superficial revelry associated with a commercial Christmas. Perhaps it would be a good thing for Santa Claus to stay home and not fly around with his reindeer and risk the spread of the coronavirus.

Every Christmas season, it used to be that when a festive penny in the cash register rings, the businessman in the shop springs with joy. It is not true Christmas Joy, but simply a festive joy. There is a difference between the two. While businesses will have to settle with less festive joy this season of Christmas amidst the Covid-19 restrictions on grand celebrations with parties and social gatherings, the true Christmas Joy for Christians can remain intact as we celebrate with Jesus in our hearts even if sans physical meetings.

Dietrich Bonhoeffer (a Lutheran theologian) said in "The Coming of Jesus in Our Midst":

"We have become so accustomed to the idea of divine love and of God's coming at Christmas that we no longer feel the shiver of fear that God's coming should arouse in us. We are indifferent to the message, taking only the pleasant and agreeable out of it and forgetting the serious aspect, that the God of the world draws near to the people of our little earth and lays claim to us."

Our Christmas joy should not be founded only on what "pleasant and agreeable" things we can take out of it. Without discounting "the shiver of fear that God's coming should arouse in us" that Bonhoeffer mentioned, we recognize the hope we have amidst a pandemic – The birth of the Christ Child, a promise fulfilled, gives us the blessed assurance of salvation that we have in Jesus!

THE JOURNEY TO CHRIST

BEFORE I trusted Christ

My family and I started attending Sunday service at JCC in 2014. We had previously come for JCC's Christmas Eve service in 2004 or 2005, when Rachel was a toddler.

HOW I trusted Christ

As I got to know more about Christ through church service, Cell Group study, Discipleship Education classes and fellowship meetings, on top of reading God's Word, my direction in life started to change.

My future and life goals were no longer confined to the world's perspective about my fate after death. By the grace of God, I know I have received my salvation; I know my future will be in heaven after my life ends on earth.

AFTERI trusted Christ

I know that by believing and following Jesus, life will not always be smooth sailing. At times, we will face heavy storms and rough seas, but Jesus never forsakes us. I know he is always with me and in me.

Early this February, I went through two major operations on my spinal cord to remove clusters of lesions found during my MRI scan in January. I thank God that the lesions extracted in the operations were benign.

However, the operations came at a cost. I lost sensation in my nerves from the waist down, with loss of control of my bladder and bowel. I am now a paraplegic.

This was a major setback in my life, affecting me not only physically and mentally, but also career-wise and putting a strain on my family.

Having accepted Christ, my perspective had



changed nonetheless. I no longer focused on the challenges and suffering, but focused on the goodness of my Father's plans for me. He is walking through this journey with us.

Without my new-found faith and trust in our Abba Father, I believe I would be terrified, anxious, lost, worried, resentful and bitter—especially the distressing experience of being confined in a hospital for over five months after three operations during the peak of the COVID-19 outbreak.

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Prayers work like a miracle. I felt at peace while waiting in the operating theatre.

I trusted that I was in the good hands of the team of surgeon, doctors and nurses sent by the Lord. During my in-hospital stay, God sent a myriad of caring rehab doctors, nurses, therapists and healthcare workers to support me in my recovery.

I also appreciate the intercessory prayers of my fellow JCCians. With aggressive therapy sessions, I gradually regained some sensation and mobility in my left foot. Though the improvement is minimal, I thank and praise God for His grace and mercy.

Christ has also given me the two most important persons in my life—my wife Ka Hui and my daughter Rachel. They have to bear the task of caregiving for me at home. I am touched that they made great effort to modify and safe-proof the house for my sake.

Just like the song lyrics to "Jesus, Strong and Kind", He satisfies me when I am thirsty, gives me strength when I am weak, shields me when I am fearful and shows me to the Cross when I am lost.

Our God is always good and faithful. I may be physically disabled now, but I trust that God has plans for me. Nothing is impossible for Him and nothing can stop my faith nor keep me from obeying God.

BEFORE I trusted Christ

I lived my life in fear and uncertainty. Even though someone shared with me about God and Jesus Christ in my teens, I was still in doubts.

I found it hard to believe that God will love someone who is basically a nobody with no achievements. And He is not expecting anything in return except for us to love Him back wholeheartedly. I also did not have the courage to accept Christ due to the fear of wrath and strong opposition from my family.

One year, I was on a vacation when I started to feel very unwell. I ended with a severe panic attack and a bad heart palpitation. The veins on my hand turned purplish and my BP rose rapidly.

Out of panic and old habits, I started calling out and praying to all the idols that I had been taught since young. As nothing seemed to happen, I slowly drifted into a deep slumber.

In my dream, I saw a very bright light in front of me and someone coming through the light. That 'someone' was dressed in a white robe with a huge pair of wings behind him. He approached me gradually and I heard a voice telling me 'DO NOT BE AFRAID, I AM HERE'.

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Then I saw a huge hand coming through a thick cloud. Out of desperation, I grabbed hold of the hand. Soon after, I fell asleep.

After I woke up, I realised that I was out of my anxiety and was overwhelmed with a strange feeling. I had not felt such calmness in a long while.

I felt a sense of peace as if someone had lifted my worries and fear from me. And that someone was watching over me, protecting me from harm. It dawned on me then that God was with me! HE had just saved me from the brink of death.

AFTER I trusted Christ

My feeling of hope started to increase as my fear and worries diminished.

My faith started to grow as well after knowing more about God's Word through the bible and attending DE classes.

Even though at times I have to face adversity, I no longer feel that I am alone as I know that God is with me. My attitude towards life and people started to change.

I am more willing to step out of my comfort zone to reach out to people around me. I know that the change did not come from my own effort. It is because I am empowered by the Holy Spirit.

I pray that God will bless me with the work of the Holy Spirit and that I will keep up the effort of walking close to Christ daily.

I didn't trust God and I just tagged along every Sunday as instructed. I even started serving in ministries, going for cell groups just to make more friends.

However, there were still some worries and doubts. Whenever I was asked this question of "Who is God to you?"

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I would just provide the model textbook answers.

But I never knew who God really is and what he meant to me as I had never felt God's presence in my life; until one day when my friend shared with me that they saw a change in my character and behaviour.

It suddenly occurred to me that it was God who had changed me. I had learnt to forgive and let go. I grew happier each day and I started to place my trust in God.

He showed me what love is all about and how to view people from a different perspective.

AFTER I trusted Christ

My views on people and things changed. I grew more optimistic as I knew that God is with me.

Knowing that God loves me unconditionally gives me the confidence that I lacked. I grew happier as each day passed.

My change also made me more aware of others' feelings and I gradually became a pillar of support

for the people around me. I never knew I could influence and impact people's life. I no longer felt as anxious or fearful when I encountered any setbacks or obstacles, as I began to trust in the power of prayers.


The year 2020 has been an unprecedented year due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

But God has been so gracious to us. Our Heavenly Father has been safeguarding us against the virus.


This year has its ups and downs. But the greatest thing that has happened is that amidst the difficult situation I was able to continue with my baptism.





PLANTING SEEDS, NURTURING MINDS

A chat with Khan Lian, JCC Sunday School Teacher

Lovingly known as "Jie Jie Khan Lian" or "Cher", Khan Lian has been attending JCC since 1995 and started serving in Sunday School since 2007. It definitely takes a big heart to help shape little minds.

We had a chat with Khan Lian to find out how she stays inspired.

For this Christmas season, we have released two


carols for your listening pleasure and you can use them for praising God in Hokkien or for outreach to your guests this Christmas. Here are the links:
